Shepherd of the Hills participates in the **Paycheck Protection Program**

Shepherd of the Hills recently applied for, and received, a loan under the Paycheck Protection Program. This government program is available to small businesses and nonprofit organizations to help pay for salaries, utilities and other expenses during the pandemic. Shepherd of the Hills has Received approximately \$29,000 from this program.

Since Shepherd of the Hills has kept all of our staff employed during this pandemic our loan will become a grant and will not have to be paid back.

The congregation has been very generous with their contributions during this difficult time, however we still find ourselves with a deficit of about \$15,000 compared to our expenses to date. This grant will be very helpful enabling us to continue our Mission here at Shepherd of the Hills.


