

Roof Project Summary

The entire roof was reshingled by Holencik Exteriors and completed on February 1, 2023. The total cost of roof was \$68,836. An additional cost of \$1,950 was due to15 pieces of plywood to be replaced because of water damage and degradation. The total monies for the roof came to \$70,786. This roof project includes a 15 year leak free guarantee and a 15- year workmanship guarantee. Yearly inspection is included for the first two years. The shingles are 50- year shingles.

The next step of the process is to remediate the mold situation in the sanctuary. We are currently looking at obtaining quotes to address the mold situation in our sanctuary.
