

Beginning June 24th and running through June 28th, 15 children and 22 volunteers participated in **SCUBA vbs.** They did some cool experiments. They learned that God is a friend who is real, who loves and who we can trust and also that God is a friend forever and a friend for everyone. They ate an assortment of underwater themed snacks and played some fun and wet games, including sailing on the sea, looking for fish in dune buggy boats and playing on a water slide. They watched for God and shared their God sight-

ings. Overall, SCUBA proved to be a fun and educational experience!

The children were asked to bring in an item for donation and change every night. These generous children brought in <u>cooking oil</u>, <u>cans of tuna</u>, <u>small flashlights and batteries</u>, <u>new wash-</u> <u>cloths</u>, <u>grape juice and grape jelly which will be donated to</u> Operation Christmas Child and the food bank. They also raised over \$114 in loose change. This will be sent to Operation Kid to Kid, who will distribute it <u>provide</u> clean water to families in rural Honduras.

Thank you to all the parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, friends and neighbors who brought the children every night to attend **SCUBA**. Without you, we wouldn't be able to have a VBS program. Thank you to everyone in the congregation who donated food items, supplies or money towards the VBS program. Your support of this program is greatly appreciated.
