## 2025 NE Synod Assembly **By Carl France**

The 38th NEPA Synod Assembly was held May 30-31 at Christ Hamilton United Lutheran Church in Stroudsburg. Pastor James Schlegel and Carl France were in attendance.

This year's assemblage kicked off with uplifting music by the Abiding Hope Band, followed by Bishop Christopher deForest's welcome, introductions, announcements and opening prayers.

Our Global Connections program commenced with a warm greeting from Bishop Tobias Bilz of Saxony, Germany. He spoke of our exchange partnership as he introduced three pastors from their Synod, Council of the Mission Districts. Gifts of Thanksgiving were exchanged with our overseas associates. The Executive Associate to the Bishop, Rev. Rachael Dietz introduced nominations and elections for Synod Council. Rev. Dietz was escorted on stage by Chipotle, a well-mannered black Labrador service dog.

Jen Bradbury, of Fuller Youth Institute and Senior Director of Family Ministry at First Elyn Presbyterian Church in Glen Elyn, IL, was the keynote speaker. Jen opened with, "Does your church prioritize young people? Growing young people is more than a strategy!" The Institute surveyed 259 churches and visited 12 churches that have excelled with young people to further research what sets them apart from the rest.

As Jen shared what the 12 churches' youth groups were doing, I thought of how our youth group is already doing everything she mentioned. A question posed by Pastor Schlegel caused me to think of our youth group. Under Lisa Kroboth's devoted, diligent, insightful leadership and Drew Null's past help and ceaseless efforts, we are following and exceeding Jen's suggestions.

Our youth group also receives Pastor Schlegel's support, guidance and direction.

Our youth group has volunteered and interacted with the residents of Phoebe and Cedarbrook Nursing Homes. Jen's recommendation to empower young people is accomplished with our annual Youth Sunday, Another of Jen's ideas is youth involvement with the community, which our youth accomplish during trick or treat with the Miracle League, the 5K race for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention and their volunteer work with Parkland Cares Food Pantry.

Fun activities like miniature golf, ax throwing and Phantoms hockey games allow our youth to share time as friends.

Jen concluded the session by remarking, "Everyone rises when we focus on our youth".

Bishop deForest's report was reviewed at length, detailing challenges faced by churches. The Bishop wants to make it possible for every congregation in the Synod to be lead by a pastor, deacon or a licensed minister. Bishop deForest exhorted those in attendance to "Empower and encourage the roles of all believers in the NEPA Synod".

Dinner was followed by worship and a reception.

Saturday's Plenary sessions opened with music by the Abiding Hope Band, followed by greetings, announcements and prayer by Bishop deForest. Pastor Doug Hill of Littleton, CO spoke about contemplative action and the use of visualization in prayer. This is accomplished by closing your eyes and visualizing those for whom you are praying while mentally picturing your intentions. Pastor Hill shared that people he has prayed for have, on some occasions, unexpectedly called him. The dynamic Pastor Hill was the best speaker of this year's assembly.

A review of the nominations and elections to Council was succeeded by Synod Treasurer Donald Boyer's report.

Keynote speaker Jen Bradbury covered this year's theme, *Connect the Dots*. She discussed a faith journey in three directions: love like Jesus, heal like Jesus and engage like Jesus. During the June 1st sermon, Pastor Schlegel focused on the *Connect the Dots* theme.

This year's program concluded with a presentation of the 2026 budget and sending worship.
